Michelle Duennes, Ph.D., Assistant Professor, Biology

Duennes teaches general biology II, ecology, evolution, and invertebrate zoology. She also advises biology majors as they develop, execute, and communicate research for their 3-semester Capstone Research Projects. Students in her lab explore a variety of topics in ecology, evolution, and conservation. The overarching goal of Duennes' research is to reveal molecular adaptations and phylogenetic/population genetic history to address how species might react to changing natural and agricultural landscapes.

Jeffrey L. Godwin, Ph.D., Associate Professor, Business Administration Dr. Jeff Godwin has academic, corporate, and church-related work experience. Before coming to Saint Vincent College, he taught at Virginia Tech while obtaining his Ph.D. In addition to teaching, he has helped a variety of organizations as a Strategic Planning Consultant. Dr. Godwin's corporate experience includes employment as a Bond Underwriter. This involved extensive financial analyses and well as evaluating corporate capacities. As Chief Operating Officer for Hospice Care Corporation, Dr. Godwin obtained health care management experience. Dr. Godwin is an Ordained Elder in The United Methodist Church. Presently he is appointed by The United Methodist Church to teach at Saint Vincent College. Michael P. Krom became a member of the Saint Vincent College faculty in 2007 after earning his Ph.D. in philosophy from Emory University and his Master of Arts degree from Boston College. Since then, he has been promoted to full professor and currently serves as chair of the philosophy department, director of Benedictine Leadership Studies, as well as director of the Faith and Reason Summer Program. He has published works in areas of moral and political philosophy with an emphasis on the relationship between Catholicism and liberalism. He recently authored a second book, *Justice and Charity: An Introduction to Aquinas's Moral, Economic, and Political Thought.* He has delivered over 40 professional papers, including invited talks at such institutions as Belmont Abbey College, Franciscan University of Steubenville, and University of Dallas. His articles have appeared in such journals as *Journal of Religious Ethics, Hobbes Studies*, and *Catholic Social Science Review.* He and his wife, Jessica, reside in Latrobe with their six children. They are members of St. Mary's Byzantine Catholic Church (Bradenville), and Dr. Krom serves there as high school ECF instructor. In addition, he is a curriculum coordinator for Christ the Divine Teacher School (Latrobe), helping to oversee its transition to a classical grammar as well as logic school.

Jeffrie A. Mallory, Ed.D., Executive Vice President

In additon to being executive vice president, Mallory serves as chief operating officer of Saint Vincent College while also offering direction to much of the student life on campus. From 2010-14, Mallory held the role of Director of Campus and Multicultural and Student Life at Saint Vincent. During his time at SVC, he also served as Assistant/Associate Men's Basketball Coach from 2009-12. Mallory is active in the region, holding a number of board positions for various foundations and groups.
