Guest Speaker: Brother Norman Hipps, OSB, President of Saint Vincent College

- Approximately 90 families currently in the Rodger Center for Get Acquainted Day (110 registered)
- \$86M in pledges or gifts received- Jim Will Hall for Engineering (wing of the science center)
- \$22million project; expand library; art displayed in the library; build up the endowment—new faculty to help with endowment (both have Ph.D.s—chemical and electric engineering);
- new faculty member in international program- From Spain, speaks German:
- Fr. Rene will be endowed chair in monastic studies;
- incoming class: fewer football players, only 450- 415, with transfers not included in that number;
- sex abuse scandal—Archabbot's response on webpage and detailed policy description that has been implemented since 1991, names released of the alleged people, 15 named individuals only 2 alive, always immediate removal of ministry.

- Revenue Goal: \$25-\$35k
- Revenue Actual: \$9,753
 - Due to attendance—goal 200+, actual attendance 106
 - Cost per person: \$80 (reduced 36 percent from last 2 years)
- Alumni Scholarship Fund: \$296,474
 - 2017-18- \$5,068 to 3 recipients
 - 2018-19- \$19,000 15 recipients
 - Why the difference in distribution—we do not distribute funds—need to get our hands back into this (financial aid, Fr. Paul, Br. Norman)
- Survey- sent to all 31 committee members, only 15 responded
- Next Meeting: August/September; location: TBD
- Wimmerstock 2019:
 - Send ideas to Ryan in the next week
 - Have a meeting to discuss ideas—too big of an issue
