GENERAL GUARANTEED ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN SAINT VINCENT COLLEGE AND WESTMORELAND COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Westmoreland County Community College (hereafter WCCC) offers associate's degrees in several academic programs; and

WHEREAS, Saint Vincent College [hereinafter, "SVC"] offers bachelor's degree programs in related academic programs; and

WHEREAS, both institutions desire to facilitate the transfer of graduates from associate's degrees in several disciplines at WCCC to subsequent bachelor's degrees at SVC; and

WHEREAS, subject to the terms of this Agreement, the student who has earned an associate degree in designated programs shall be guaranteed admission with advanced standing at the junior level to SVC.

NOW THEREFORE, SVC and WCCC officially confirm the following terms of this agreement:

- **1. Admission.** In order to qualify for the Guaranteed Articulation Program, students must be admitted to WCCC in a program that has been articulated with SVC.
- **2. Reservation of Student Placement.** The Office of Admissions at SVC reserves a place for the student as a junior year transfer student in a specific major upon receipt of the student's Letter of Intent. Some degree programs are very competitive and may require a higher grade point average as well as compliance with other special admission criteria. Students should refer to the criteria which appear within the articulated program outline.
- **3. Tuition and Fees.** WCCC tuition and fees will be charged to students for WCCC courses. SVC tuition and fees will be charged to students for SVC courses. Each institution will be responsible for collection of tuition and fees for courses transcripted by their institution. Financial Aid will be issued by WCCC until the student transfers to SVC as a junior year transfer student. Once the student transfers to SVC, he/she will receive financial aid through the university. Until that time, it is the student's responsibility to inform the WCCC financial aid office when he/she is enrolled in an SVC course.
- 4. Admission of Transfer Student. One semester prior to matriculation at SVC, the student submits the transfer admissions application with appropriate fee. Admission to most SVC programs is assured with the completion of an associate's degree and compliance with standards specified in the articulated program. However, some competitive programs require a higher cumulative average as well as compliance with other special admissions requirements. If a student does not submit formal application within two years from the date of the Letter of Intent, he/she must apply as a regular transfer student and will be required to meet the then current degree requirements of the major.

- **5.** Acceptance into Bachelor's Degree Program. Upon formal acceptance into a specific major, SVC will acknowledge the student's intent to enroll and the student must submit appropriate advanced deposits that will be credited toward first semester fees.
- **6. Student Transcript.** The student must forward to the SVC Office of Admissions an official final WCCC transcript verifying receipt of the associate degree prior to registering at SVC. Costs associated with the transcript will be paid by the student.
- **7. Academic Policies and Requirements.** The student while enrolled either at WCCC or SVC shall comply with each school's academic policies and requirements. However, the specific academic policies in effect for the bachelor's degree as awarded by SVC will be as such during the time of the student's enrollment into the program.
- **8. Discipline Policies.** The student while enrolled either at WCCC or SVC shall comply with each school's discipline policies and requirements. However, the specific discipline policies/requirements in effect for the bachelor's degree as awarded by SVC will be as such during the time of the student's enrollment into the program.
- **9. Transfer Credit.** Attached hereto, incorporated herein as part of this Agreement are articulated programs designed by representatives of WCCC and SVC. This Agreement confirms that SVC accepts up to 62 credits toward core curriculum and major requirements as well as free electives as designated by the articulated programs in Exhibits B through G. These courses must be completed to be awarded the bachelor's degree from SVC.
- **10. Marketing and Recruitment**. In addition to the public announcement at the Articulated Agreement signing ceremony, the institutions will join together in a marketing campaign. SVC will print initial materials and add information to its website for the benefit of personnel of both institutions. WCCC will include the program, upon review by SVC, among its recruitment materials.
- **11. University Representatives/Monitors.** Representatives from both institutions will be appointed to evaluate the Agreement in operation.
- **12. Term of Agreement.** The term of this Agreement shall be October 1, 2012 to September 30, 2017.

13. Mutual Terms and Conditions.

- a. *Term of Agreement*. The term of this Agreement shall be five (5) years from the date of execution. This Agreement may not exceed a period of five (5) years.
- b. *Termination of Agreement*. SVC or WCCC may terminate this Agreement for any reason with ninety (90) days of notice. Either party may terminate this Agreement in the event of a substantial breach upon 30 days notice. However, should WCCC terminate this Agreement prior to the completion of an academic semester, all students enrolled at that time may continue their educational experience until it would have been concluded absent the termination.
- c. *Nondiscrimination*. The parties agree to continue their respective policies of nondiscrimination based on Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 in regard to sex, age, race, color, creed, national origin. Title IX of the Education
- d. Amendments of 1972 and other applicable laws, as well as the provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- e. *Interpretation of the Agreement*. The laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania shall govern this Agreement.
- f. *Modification of Agreement*. This Agreement shall only be modified in writing with the same formality as the original Agreement.
- g. Relationship of Parties. The relationship between the parties to this Agreement to each other is that of independent contractors. The relationship of the parties to this contract to each other shall not be construed to constitute a partnership, joint venture or any other relationship, other than that of independent contractors.
- h. *Liability*. Neither of the parties shall assume any liabilities to each other. As to liability to each other or death to persons, or damages to property, the parties do not waive any defense as a result of entering into this contract.
- Entire Agreement. This Agreement represents the entire understanding between the parties.
 No other prior or contemporaneous oral or written understandings or promises exist in regard to this relationship.
