All About Check-In

When should I arrive?

Please arrive to Check-In on Friday, August 28.

Check-in is mandatory as are the other weekend events.

- Last names beginning with A-M: 1:00 - 1:45 p.m.
- Last names beginning with N-Z: 1:50 - 2:30 p.m.

Where should I go?

- Park in Lot A near the Fred Rogers Center, then proceed directly to the Citrone Family Commuter Center, located in Placid Hall near the Post Office and Community Center Dining Room.
- If you are a **varsity athlete**, check-in at the Fred Rogers Center located next to Lot A to meet with the athletic training staff prior to checking-in at the Commuter Center.

What can I expect to receive at Check-In?

You will receive your student ID card, important first-year student information, and Welcome Weekend packet. You will also meet other commuters and start to build your new home on campus.

How do I get my parking permit?

If you plan to have a vehicle on campus, you must obtain a parking permit from the Public Safety Office. Submit your permit request online, and your permit will be delivered to your campus mailbox. Parking permits must be displayed in vehicles at all times. Vehicles without a valid permit will be subject to ticketing beginning the first week of classes.

All Saint Vincent College students are assigned a mailbox. Go to the mail room located in Headmasters Hall to obtain your mailbox key, which is yours for the duration of your time at Saint Vincent College. You will be charged for a lost key.

Important Information About Financial Clearance

All students must be financially cleared **PRIOR TO** check-in.

- If you have paid your balance or arranged for your balance to be paid, you will receive a message on the student portal beginning in early August indicating that you have financial clearance.
- If you arrive on campus without financial clearance you will be directed to the Business Office to resolve your balance before receiving your ID or being permitted to take classes.
